

<p>Mini Wholecloths</p> <p>Visit my new Mini Wholecloth category and check out the new patterns. The first 2 are based on Japanese Bloom and Pretty point. They are basically 9 blocks with a swag border around them... The wholecloths are stitched out in one pass, so their size is only limited to the width of your throat space. They make lovely table centres or thrown over the back of an armchair. They would also look great made up into a European Pillow cover.</p> <p>Mini Whole Clothes priced at \$30 AUD Currency Converter</p> <p>New Pantographs</p> <p>There are 5 New Pantograph Patterns</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Japanese Bloom ● Heart De Lis ● Pretty Point ● Primitive Stars ● Cotton Bud <p>Pantographs priced at \$15 AUD Currency Converter</p>	<p>Think Outside the Square</p> <p>Just recently I had a Dresden plate quilt to quilt which was made up of Dresden Plate blocks that where sashed and then had a plain border as large as the blocks(approx 13 inches). In the old freehand days I would have cringed at all that plain area, but with the Statler I was rubbing my hands together!</p> <p>I decided to use my Japanese Bloom Collection. For around the Dresdens I had to re work one of the frame patterns so it would fit with a flower in the corners and a swirl around the edges. Then I digitized a sashing pattern that could be quilted as a single block in the sashings.</p> <p>Then I came to the borders... eek... I wanted to use one of my block patterns, but I just couldn't get enough repeats that where square. Then I decided to quilt the block pattern in the corners and in the borders lining up the blocks in the centre... this left a 3" gap between the quilted blocks. So I just treated them like the sashing within the quilt and quilted the sashing pattern between the blocks...
